Presbyterians & Habitat— Since 1996, local Presbyterian churches have partnered with the Greater Charlottesville Habitat for Humanity, and Habitat's partner families & other sponsors to construct affordable housing (serving those making 25-60% area median income). We have completed 13 homes; approximately 20% of Habitat's housing stock. 2010 marks a new administrative format for the Presbytery of the James, and also new construction designs and methods at Habitat. The design is a 4family row house. On July 10 & 11, and 17 & 18, Presbyterian House #14 will start with an old-fashioned barn raising blitz. Habitat expects about 80-100 people (30-40 Presbyterians) each day from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Because of the large number of volunteers on site, having as many crew leaders (skilled person who can lead 35 others in a given task) as possible is essential for a successful workday.
