### ADULT CLASSES MARCH FOR MARCH 28

Course: **Genesis – From The Beginning....**

An in-depth study of the first book of the Christian Old Testament and of the first book of the Jewish Law (the Torah or Pentateuch); this book tells of man's first at-

tempts at addressing his reason for existence and his relationship with the Divine Creator. How were we created and why? How did sin enter into the world? What agreements (Covenants) have existed between the Divine and Man? What are the origins of the Hebrew/Jewish people and the Jewish/Christian tradition? Much as we have done with our previous Bible studies of Abraham through Revelation, we will use the Logos Digital Library system to help explore this work including inputs from various dictionaries, commentaries and original language studies – except this time we'll take it "from the beginning".

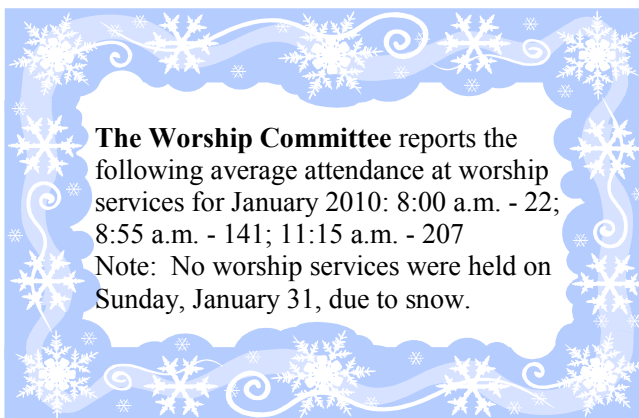
Course: **Spiritual Journeys**
